Retail Clinic Partnerships: The Value Proposition for Hospitals and Health Systems

A Report from the Convenient Care Association

Introduction

The retail clinic industry was founded upon the principles of providing accessible, affordable high-quality healthcare to Americans. Since its inception, the retail health industry has grown and advanced in several ways such as through the increased number of clinic locations and the services offered in the clinics. One of the most striking changes over time has been the vastly increased involvement of provider groups. While some traditional healthcare providers initially felt threatened by a disruptive newcomer to the healthcare landscape, the number of hospitals and health systems joining forces with retail clinics has nearly doubled in the last year with over 100 systems actively involved in operating or partnering with retail clinics.




Figure 1: Hospitals and Health Systems with Retail Clinic Affiliations

Figure 1 illustrates the hospital and health systems affiliated with or operating retail clinics. Appendix A provides the complete list.

Core Benefits of Partnerships

The partnerships between retail clinics and hospitals and health systems provide a number of key benefits for both entities. Key benefits include the expansion of access to care, service expansion opportunities such as chronic disease management and maintenance, enhanced quality monitoring and improvement programs and ongoing support of continuity of care as well as compliance with the Affordable Care Act.

Access Expansion

Access to healthcare remains problematic for millions of Americans. Even before the Affordable Care Act (ACA) was enacted, retail clinic pioneers recognized the need for access to affordable, high-quality basic primary healthcare in convenient settings and the industry was founded upon those principles. Research has shown that retail clinics are the lowest unsubsidized provider of healthcare: (1) over 30 percent of the U.S. population lives within a ten-minute drive of a retail clinic, (2) and the quality of care provided in the clinics is the same or superior to that of traditional medical settings such as emergency departments and urgent care centers. (3) Through partnerships with retail clinics, hospitals and health systems expand their networks, increase access to services for existing patients and increase their presence in areas where they may not have physical locations.

Collaboration between retail clinics and health systems provide a vehicle for network expansion and increased access to care for existing patients.

For many patients, a retail clinic visit is their first contact with the complex healthcare system and as many as 60 percent of retail clinic patients do not have an established primary care provider. (4) Through affiliations with the health systems, retail clinics can offer patients easier access to the affiliated health systems.

Similarly, hospitals and health systems work with retail clinics for after-hours routine care that may have previously been handled needlessly in the emergency department. One study demonstrated that approximately a quarter of emergency department visits could be handled at a retail clinic. (5) Diverting patients with non-emergent medical needs from the emergency department save hospitals and health systems millions of dollars each year.

Telehealth is also being used by retail clinics, hospitals and health systems to expand access to care, particularly in rural and underserved

Hospital Considerations for Retail Clinic Affiliations

- Do they want a low cost, walk in option in their service line for the community?
- Do patients have difficulty in accessing the health system for care, are there needless waits?
- Do patients have difficulty accessing primary care physicians, delays, closed panels, inconvenient office hours, etc.?
- Do they want to grow primary care business for their system?
- Do they have an emphasis on affecting population health in a positive way?
- Do they recognize retail health as a tool to manage the population of an ACO?
- Do they want to decant their emergency rooms of patients that don't belong there?

areas. Telehealth consultations in the retail clinic setting can connect patients with hospitals and health systems who would not normally have access to those providers. Working collaboratively, a hospital or health system specialist and retail clinic practitioner can effectively care for a patient with a condition or illness that is not routinely treated in the clinics.

Health System Perspectives

Research has shown that patients like telehealth visits. CVS Health Research Institute recently released the results of a study regarding patient satisfaction of telehealth visits provided at MinuteClinic® retail clinics and found that 95% of patients said they were highly satisfied with the quality of the care they received and over one-third of them preferred a telehealth visit to a traditional doctor's office visit. With approximately 25 percent of the American population without an establish primary care provider, (6) the growing primary care provider shortage and overall shortage of healthcare providers in rural areas, telehealth provides one possible solution, and a definite benefit, by broadening the reach of hospitals and health systems.

Service Expansion

At the outset of the industry, the clinics only treated a limited number of illnesses such as strep throat, mononucleosis, influenza and sinus, ear and upper respiratory infections. Today, most retail clinics offer basic acute care for minor illness and injuries, wellness and preventive services and some chronic disease care.

The expansion of services offered in the clinics was undertaken to meet the needs and demand of consumers. Many clinics now offer chronic disease care for conditions like diabetes, hypertension, obesity and hyperlipidemia. There is a strong focus on screening and management of chronic conditions, with management being provided in conjunction with a hospital or health system. As the industry began offering screenings and management of chronic conditions, the Healthcare Clinic at Walgreens saw an increase in chronic disease screening and management in 2013, (7) signifying that patients are seeking care for chronic conditions in the retail clinics.

Clinical collaborations, ongoing monitoring, screenings and assessments are completed using evidence-based guidelines and shared information through electronic health records. Embedded within the electronic health records are clinical protocols which both health systems and retail clinic providers follow, permitting patients to have access to the same care plan regardless of whether they are being seen in the traditional hospital or health system setting or the retail clinic setting. Such access should lead to increased treatment adherence and

improved patient outcomes. Many clinics support chronic disease care efforts for those patients with well-managed illnesses, freeing up hospitals and health systems to treat patients with more complex conditions.

One example of a partnership facilitating the expansion of services including chronic disease care is Target Clinics and Kaiser Permanente. The two groups teamed up to provide increased access to a wide array of primary healthcare services, as well as expanded services not typically available in Target Clinics. The services offered in this partnership include traditional retail clinic services in addition to pediatric and adolescent care, well-woman care, family planning, and management of chronic conditions like diabetes and high blood pressure. Through their collaboration, Kaiser Permanente provides licensed nurse practitioners and licensed vocational nurses to staff Target clinics and have physicians available for telemedicine consultations.

Improved Quality of Care

The retail clinic industry remains committed to providing high-quality healthcare. Studies continue to demonstrate that the quality of care provided in the retail clinics remains high and exceed national standards. (8) Collaborating on clinical guidelines and protocols for new services and for treating and managing chronic conditions is one example demonstrating how partnerships between health systems and retail clinics improve the quality of care provided.

Additionally, the use of the hospital and health systems' primary care providers to act as collaborative physicians provides for provider chart reviews and consultative needs.

Finally, retail clinics, in partnership with hospitals and health systems, have assisted with reducing hospital readmissions by seeing those newly-discharged patients who could not get an appointment with their primary care provider within a 30-day, post-discharge time frame. Studies have shown that patients seen within that 30-day period of time have lower incidences of readmission. (9) With payers moving from volume-based reimbursement to value-based reimbursement, similar programs will prove beneficial for not only the patient but the hospitals and health systems as well. The use of innovative programs in retail clinics, such as predictive analytics, help the clinics predict the decline of health in patients and take proactive measures with their affiliate hospitals and health systems.

Increased Continuity of Care & ACA Compliance

The final key benefit of retail clinic-hospital/health systems partnerships is increased continuity and coordination of care for patients and greater population health.

A differentiating characteristic of retail clinics is their continuous and successful efforts to understand the gaps in the healthcare system and the identification of strategies to meet the needs of both consumers and healthcare entities. The clinics were once coined a "disruptive innovation" by Clayton Christensen because of the impact that they have had on thinking about healthcare and healthcare delivery. Retail clinics brought transparency and convenience to an industry that traditionally lacked both. Early opposition to the clinics included the argument that the clinics would disrupt the patient-primary care provider relationship.

With the ACA's focus on population health and wellness and the expansion of access to high quality, low-cost healthcare – the guiding principles of the retail clinic industry – the clinics help the systems to align with the ACA requirements of accessible, affordable preventive and primary care.

Retail clinics continue to view themselves as a complement to primary care providers. Partnerships with hospitals and health systems allow for data sharing through the integration of electronic health records enabling providers to have access to a patient's most current medical records and medical history. The integration of retail clinics within health systems also assists with coordination of care and assists in the establishment of medical homes for patients. Moreover, these collaborations help to improve population health through the joint management of acute and chronic diseases and conditions and medication management and adherence, which reduces costly emergency department visits.

Through the efforts of the retail clinics in providing access to immunization programs, preventive and wellness programs and collaborative treatment and management of chronic disease, hospitals and health systems recognize the vital role that the retail clinics play and how retail clinics allow hospitals and health systems to have a larger primary care footprint and deliver care more efficiently.

Conclusion

- Expanded access to lives, as well as the ability to provide convenient access to retail healthcare services.
- Opportunities to leverage retail clinic programs and services.
- Patients will benefit from more convenient access to trusted healthcare providers in the community – offering extended evening and weekend hours.
- Electronic health records and billing systems will help to deliver a seamless patient experience across their respective touch points, ensuring better continuity of patient care.
- Affiliations can further improve care coordination and continuity of patient care and help facilitate the transition of retail healthcare from urgent episodic conditions to chronic care management, while also strengthening the health system partnerships.
- By working together, a more complete continuum of care is created while gaps are addressed.
